A trained health liaison officer has been appointed in each camp and will be responsible for enforcing all COVID-19 procedures. Temperature checks are done and recorded twice daily for all staff as well as guests. Anyone showing unduly high temperatures will be asked to isolate in their rooms and await further guidance.

What can we both do?

Personal hygiene is the single most effective defence against transmission, so all our staff have been re-trained in correct sanitizing and personal hygiene procedures with a focus on limiting the transmission.


Please join us in the following measures we have put in place:

- Hand Washing - our camp teams wash their hands thoroughly, often and after contact with surfaces.
- We do not welcome our guests with handshaking. Rather, guests are greeted with a traditional song, dance, and a friendly smile.
- Hand sanitizer is available throughout the camp and on our vehicles. We use alcohol-based hand sanitizer as a supplement to proper hand-washing techniques and sanitary wipes are provided in all public areas to allow guests to wipe down personal items before use. Bottles of hand sanitizers are placed in all public areas, guest rooms and game vehicles.
- Coughing and Sneezing - tissues are made available in all public areas and sneeze and cough etiquette training is conducted with all staff.

And finally, we encourage all staff to wear masks at all times; we are particularly sensitive to this and we take great care during hosting and activities.

We also kindly request that, regardless of whether or not you have been vaccinated, that you kindly adhere to the same etiquette for everyone's safety.

We have a trained health paramedic based at our Somalisa, Nyamatusi and Bumi Hills properties. They, along with the camp hosts are responsible for assessing and enforcing all COVID-19 procedures. Temperature checks are done and recorded twice daily for all staff as well as guests. Anyone showing unduly high temperatures will be asked to isolate in their rooms and await further guidance.

What can we both do?

Personal hygiene is the single most effective defence against transmission, so all our staff have been re-trained in correct sanitizing and personal hygiene procedures with a focus on limiting the transmission.

Please join us in the following measures we have put in place:

- Hand Washing - our camp teams wash their hands thoroughly, often and after contact with surfaces.
- Hand sanitizer and sanitary wipes are placed in convenient locations throughout the camps and personal sanitizer dispensers are made available during arrival at camp.
- We do not welcome our guests with handshaking. Rather, guests are greeted with a traditional song, dance, and a friendly smile.

We use alcohol-based hand sanitizer as a supplement to proper hand-washing techniques and sanitary wipes are provided in all public areas to allow guests to wipe down personal items before use. Bottles of hand sanitizers and packets of sanitary wipes are placed in all public areas, guest rooms and game vehicles.
- Coughing and Sneezing - tissues are made available in all public areas and sneeze and cough etiquette training is conducted with all staff.
