VICTORIA FALLS & THE ZAMBEZI NATIONAL PARK

Together, Victoria Falls National Park and Zambezi National Park span an impressive 56,000 hectares of protected wilderness in northwestern Zimbabwe. These two parks offer a breathtaking blend of natural wonder and rich biodiversity, making them a must-visit for nature lovers and adventure seekers alike.

Victoria Falls National Park is home to the world-renowned Victoria Falls, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. A unique feature of this park is the lush rainforest nourished by the constant spray of the thundering falls. This mist creates an ethereal atmosphere, often described as a "smoke that thunders," and supports a rare ecosystem of ferns, palms, liana vines, and towering mahogany trees—vegetation not found elsewhere in the region.

Just upstream, Zambezi National Park offers a more tranquil but equally captivating experience. Though one of Zimbabwe's smaller national parks, it is among the most scenic, with the mighty Zambezi River winding through mopane woodlands and savannah. The riverbanks are dotted with hippos and crocodiles, while the park's interior is home to a wide variety of wildlife, including four of the Big Five—elephant, lion, buffalo, and leopard—as well as sable antelope, giraffe, and zebra. The park is divided into two distinct sections: the Riverine side, known for its water—based game viewing, and the Chamabonda Vlei, a hidden gem rich in plains game and predators.

Interesting Facts:

The Zambezi River Game Drive route offers stunning views and frequent sightings of elephants, hippos, and crocodiles, especially during the dry season when animals gather at the water.

With over 400 recorded bird species, including the African skimmer, goliath heron, and lanner falcon, the park is a haven for birdwatchers year—round.

The Zambezi River is famous for tiger fishing, attracting anglers from around the world hoping to catch the fierce and fast tiger fish, along with over 75 other fish species.

The park is divided into two main sections: the Riverine side, which follows the Zambezi River, and the Chamabonda Vlei, a more open savannah area rich in plains game and predators.

VICTORIA FALLS Mosi va-Tunya The smoke that thunders

Interesting Facts:

- Also known as 'Mosi oa-Tunya' ('the smoke that thunders')
- Positioned almost exactly halfway along the mighty Zambezi River's 2700 km journey from its source to sea.
- Has the largest curtain of falling water in the world.
- One of the seven natural wonders of the world.
- Has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- 75% of the falls are seen from the Zimbabwean side, with 16 viewpoints within the Rainforest from which to view it.
- Victoria Falls is roughly twice the size of America's Niagra Falls.
- The spray from The Falls typically rises to a height of over 400 metres, sometimes even twice as high.
- The spray is visible up to 48km away.
- The falls never dry up, even at the height of the dry season, the main falls and devil's cataract maintain the impressive, thunderous water flow.

VISITING THE FALLS

U Men to visit

The Victoria Falls is a year-round destination, every season brings something distinct to appreciate, even when the water levels of the falls are low, you will have amazing panoramic views and the opportunity to spot numerous rainbows above and right in the middle of the falls including perfect conditions for activities such as white-water rafting.

November to Early April / Rainy Season

- The Zambezi River fills up to dramatic levels.
- Spectacular views of the Victoria Falls.
- Thick mist-spray may be seen from kilometers away.

February to May / Flood Season

- The water level of the Zambezi River is at its highest.
- Highest and largest volume of water.
- More water than any other waterfall in

May to September / Dry Season

- Best for game viewing.
- The days are mild and sunny.
- Wildlife can be more easily spotted as they congregate around water holes.

October to November / Hot Season

- Daytime temperatures exceeding 30 degrees.
- The perfect time to enjoy game viewing during the cooler hour of dawn and dusk of water.
- The falls have less spray.



WEATHER & WHAT TO PACK



Rainfall primarily occurs during December, January, February and March, the night-time temperatures begin to decrease in late March and by May most of the rainfall is gone. Nights in June, July, and August become much cooler, and the days are clear and often cloudless with game sighting improving continually, during this period we encourage guests to pack warmer clothing.

During September and October, the temperatures rise again, and guests can expect to see some fantastic game, as Zimbabwe's wildlife sightings increases around the Zambezi River due to limited water resources.

During November, despite being hot and dry, you can experience the season's first rainfall. Average high temperatures during the summer (December – February) are between 33–35 Degrees Celsius and average lows between 15–19 Degrees Celsius.

WHAT TO PACK

- We encourage guests to choose clothing in neutral colors such as brown, khaki, stone or beige which attract less attention from animals.
 We recommend layering your clothing as this is the most practical way to cope with fluctuating day/night temperatures.

- Suitable sunblock (SPF 15+)
- UV protection sunglasses and a protective case
- Comfortable sneakers/sandals/walking shoes for game walks
- Flip-flops or similar for pool or in-room use
- Protective cap or hat to keep dust/sun from your head
- Windbreaker/fleece jacket for layering during game drives in the evening
- Jeans (one or two pairs)
- · Khaki or cotton pants/slacks, for dinner time
- Light weight rain jacket
- Comfortable shorts and T-shirts (daytime)
- Long sleeved shirts and trousers (nighttime)
- · Insect repellent
- Moisturizer, lip balm
- · Camera, film, or memory card
- Binoculars
- Reading and writing materials (journal)
- · Bathing suit
- Socks
- Neutral clothing

TRAVELLING TO VICTORIA FALLS

By Plane

Victoria Falls town in Zimbabwe and Livingstone town in Zambia both have international airports, multiple airlines fly in per day from various destinations. You can also fly into Kasane Airport in Botswana and take an hour-long road transfer into Victoria Falls town (this transfer does involve a border crossing) which is an important factor to be included during decision making.

Likewise, Zambia's Lusaka Airport is roughly a ten-hour road transfer or an additional flight from Livingstone Town. Flying to these airports, therefore, would not be ideal if you want to get to Victoria Falls or Livingstone. Zimbabwe has two other international airports in Harare and Bulawayo; however, these are hundreds of kilometers away, and getting to Victoria Falls from there would require an additional flight, or a long road transfer.

VICTORIA FALLS International airport

Welcomes daily flights from South Africa, mainly OR Tambo International Airport (Johannesburg) and Cape Town International Airport. Some major airlines that offer flights into Victoria Falls include, British Airways, South African Airways and Air Zimbabwe.

HARRY MWANGA NKUMBULA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Formerly Livingstone Airport, is an international airport in Livingstone, Zambia. Welcomes daily flights from South Africa (Johannesburg, Cape Town, Nelspruit), Kenya (Nairobi) and Ethiopia (Addis Ababa). Some major airlines that offer flights into Victoria Falls include, British Airways, South African Airways, Kenya Airways, Ethiopia Airways. Some of our guests also fly via Kasane International Airport located in the North–West District in Botswana. We arrange transfers from Kasane at an additional cost and the transfer takes roughly 1 hour and 15 minutes, transfers to Zambezi Sands can be booked at reservations.gbl@batokahospitality.com



By Train

Our guests may travel to Victoria Falls by train, namely the Rovos Rail. The luxury train trip guarantees a travelling journey as spectacular as its destination, travelling through some of the most scenic landscapes in Southern Africa. The threenight adventure begins in Pretoria, South Africa and winds its way through the Warm baths, named for its hot springs, and Nylstroom, named after the Nile River. The train then crosses the Tropic of Capricorn en-route to the border with Zimbabwe.

The next morning, the train travels towards Bulawayo, a major city of Zimbabwe. The following day sees the train travelling along one of the world's longest stretches of straight railway line — 114kms — before reaching Hwange National Park, a diverse wildlife sanctuary where animals can be spotted from the train. The trip ends the following day when it reaches its destination at Victoria Falls.



TRAVELLING TO VICTORIA FALLS



Many guests often self-drive to Zambezi Sands Luxury Tented Lodge. We provide safe parking. The distance from Johannesburg via Botswana is 1201km and the distance from Johannesburg via Zimbabwe is 1300km. Travelling time is estimated at over 17 hours, therefore it is recommended to plan a stop along the way.

Recommended Routes to Batoka Zambezi Sands:

FROM VICTORIA FALLS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Estimated travel time (1hr 30min)

- Head east towards the A8.
- After 260m turn left onto the A8 towards Victoria Falls town and proceed for 19 km.
- Turn left onto Kazungula Road and proceed for 28 km to our private entrance to the Zambezi National Park.
- · Here you will be met by a 4x4 vehicle to be transferred through the park to Zambezi Sands at the water's edge.

FROM KASANE (KAZUNGULA BORDER POST - BOTSWANA)

Estimated travel time (1hr 25min)

- From Kasane Airport / town proceed to the Kazungula Border Post to Zimbabwe.
- From the Kazungula Border Post travel on the road towards Victoria Falls for 41 km to reach our private entrance to the Zambezi National Park.
- · Here you will be met by a 4x4 vehicle to be transferred through the park to Zambezi Sands at the water's edge.

FROM LIVINGSTONE (VICTORIA FALLS BORDER POST - ZAMBIA)

Estimated travel time (3hr 35min)

- Travel towards Victoria Falls town, cross the border post, cross the bridge and proceed straight through the town of Victoria Falls on Livingstone Way/Mosi-Oa-Tunya/A8 out of town.
- Turn right onto Kazungula Road and proceed for 28 km to our private entrance to Zambezi National Park.
- Here you will be met by a 4x4 vehicle to be transferred through the park to Zambezi Sands at the water's edge.

FROM VICTORIA FALLS TOWN

Estimated travel time(1 hour 10 min)

- Take Livingstone Way/Mosi-Oa-Tunya/A8 out of town.
- Turn left onto Kazungula Road and proceed for 28 km to our private entrance to the Zambezi National Park.
- Here you will be met by a 4x4 vehicle to be transferred through the park to Zambezi Sands at the water's edge.
